Dear Colleagues in Horticultural Therapy,

Spring is arriving!

AHTA is celebrating 50 years! In looking at the history, present state, and future opportunities AHTA is acknowledging change. To quote Clarissa Pinkola Estes, American poet, post-trauma specialist, Jungian psychoanalyst, and author of *Women Who Run with the Wolves*, "When a great ship is in the harbor and moored, it is safe, there is no doubt. But that is not what great ships are for."

AHTA is that great ship, and we are now on the sea of change. At the March Board of Directors meeting held on **March 10-11, 2023**, the board planted those seeds of change. Here are the highlights:

- AHTA's virtual conference "AHTA 2023: 50 years of Cultivating
 Horticultural Therapy" will be held on October 20-21, 2023. The
 board approved reducing student rates to help in the inclusion of a
 younger audience.
- The board approved the revision of the student packet and is working on targeted outreach to young adults, LGBTQAI+, BIPOC, people with disabilities, and organizations representing these groups.
- We approved pre-approval for the coursework program.
- The board is considering stackable credentials for our HTR process.
- The requirements of internship supervisors have changed, dropping the requirement of one year of full-time work or 2000 hours of work experience.

- The grandfathering clause for coursework prior to 2013 was revisited and approved to continue.
- The board approved open access for our Journal of Therapeutic Horticulture.

Please note these changes will take time to be implemented, but the board is actively taking steps to put these changes in place. Stay tuned for updates in this newsletter and the upcoming board bulletin!

I invite you all to get involved with the spring forward season of change for AHTA. Post your event for **National Horticultural Therapy Week**, **become a member**, and stand strong for the profession by joining the AHTA work teams, review boards, and board of directors to help in the growth of AHTA!
